Dear Parents and Caregivers

Swimming commenced on Tuesday and is progressing in a satisfactory manner. The ability to swim safely is an essential skill to possess considering Australia's climate. We thank parents and carers for their support of this program. We also thank the P and C for their financial support to the swimming program, that has significantly reduced costs to families.

The 100 Nights of Reading is now well underway. The ability to read is an essential skill for students to possess and this program provides a simple mechanism to encourage reading every night. Thank you to those parents who are supporting their children to read every night.

Student Semester One Reports will be issued on the 29 June. Due to COVID-19 implications the school reports this semester will contain grades, rating scales for personal effort and so forth and a general comment. Literacy and numeracy comments will not be included this semester. If parents or carers require further information, please contact your child's classroom teacher to arrange for a face-to-face or phone interview.

The school still has many rapid antigen tests that have not been collected. These tests have been provided free to students. Each student has been allocated 20 tests. The tests can be picked up from the school office. The only requirement is that the tests must be picked up by an adult.

We are continuing to reinforce the school values that have the acronym "FRED". The students are familiar with "FRED" and know it to stand for Friendship, Respect, Excellence and Determination. These values are reinforced regularly in the classroom and while-school events such as assemblies. It is pleasing to note that the vast majority of students are strong supporters of these values.

Students are currently training for the school cross country which will be conducted on Friday 24 June from 9.00 am. Parents and carers are invited to attend the cross country to support their children.

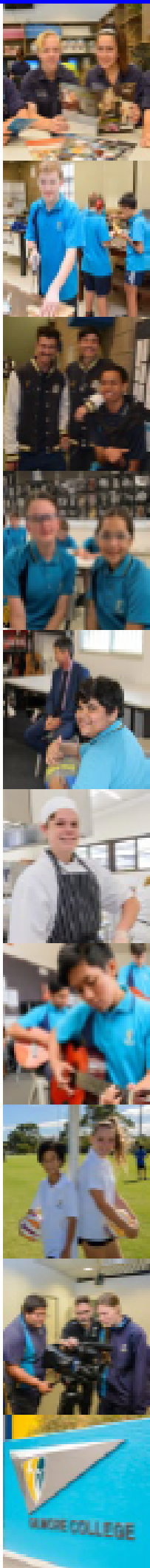
