Aussie of the Month

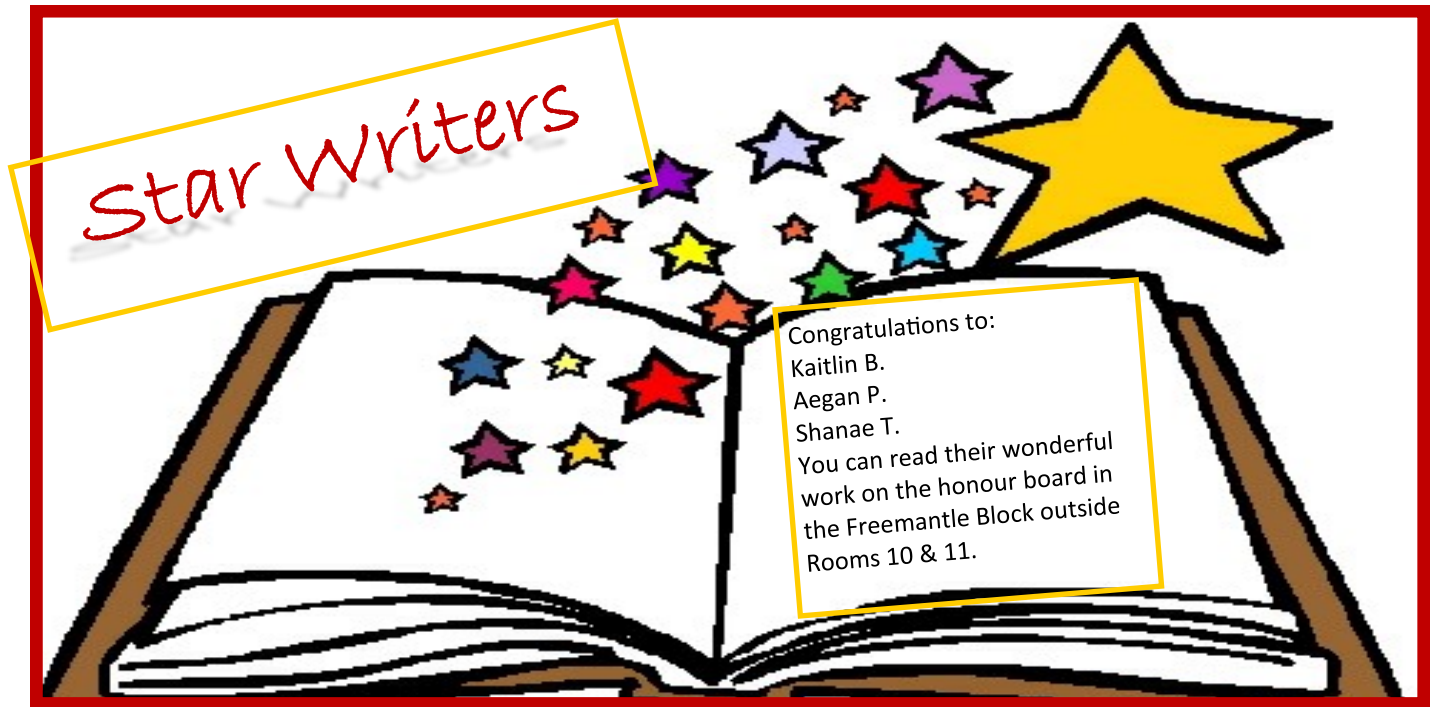
The Aussie of the Month award recognises personal endeavour, achievement and contribution to the community.
