THE SCHOOL

North Parmelia Primary School is situated in Kwinana, approximately 40km south of Perth and was built in 1971. The Kwinana railway station is situated approximately 800 metres from the school.

Academic and social success is a high priority at our school. A strong pastoral care program ensures students demonstrate high standards of behaviour, supported by the school's inclusive and safe learning environment. The whole school approach of 'Friendly Schools Plus' supports the positive school culture.

TECHNOLOGY

Two computer laboratories are in operation at the school to enable whole class activities to be conducted.

The library is fully automated and students can complete book searches as well as research information.

Information Technology is an ongoing priority within the school and the use of technology in the curriculum is supported by all teachers. We have completed an acquisition program for interactive panels and ipads, which are now in all classrooms.

COMMUNICATION

Communication is achieved through the newsletter which is available online and the P&C facebook page, class meetings, semester reports, parent interviews, parent open night, general discussion, social interaction, assemblies and carnivals. Parents are also encouraged to visit school at any time to discuss programs and their child's progress. An appointment is necessary if you wish to discuss matters with teachers and the administrative staff.

Parents are able to notify the school of student absences via phone call, website, email or directly to the classroom teacher. Some classes also have class apps available for notifications. Reminder messages are sent out regularly for community events via email and on the school website.

Issues related to school are discussed at meetings of the School Council and Parents and Citizens Association. The newsletter is published online at www.npps.wa.edu.au. All North Parmelia Primary School community members are welcome to attend the first School Council Meeting of the year held in Term 1.

ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS

Specialist programs will operate at North Parmelia PS in 2024 to support and extend student learning. The teachers will instruct children in Art, LOTE (Indonesian), Physical Education and Technology.

The Art Program and the Physical Education programs are highly developed, delivering positive outcomes and high levels of motivation.

The LOTE program was a new program introduced in 2018 with children from years 3 to 6 being instructed in the Indonesian language.

Technologies encompasses Maths, Science and HASS whilst using digital technologies within the program.

PRIORITIES

LITERACY

Literacy has been a major focus for some years and we are very fortunate to be fully equipped with a wide range of reading resources. A whole school approach is in place that uses explicit teaching and learning intentions.

Evidence-based English programs are followed to teach skills across all year levels such as Letters and Sounds and more recently Talk4Writing. This program encourages students to orally learn texts, innovate stories and expand their writing vocabulary.

MATHEMATICS—NUMERACY

Similarly a whole school approach to numeracy instruction has been implemented. The school incorporates explicit teaching with clear learning intentions using Dr Paul Swan's resources and teaching strategies.

STEAM—SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, ARTS & MATHEMATICS

STEAM is an approach to learning that integrates the areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, The Arts and Mathematics. North Parmelia Primary School is focused on providing opportunities for its students in STEAM. In doing so we develop the required enterprise skills of:

Creativity Critical Analysis Problem Solving Teamwork Independent Thinking Communication Initiative Digital Literacy

As continual advances in technology are changing the way students learn, connect and interact every day, skills developed by students through STEAM provide them with the foundation to succeed at school and beyond.

FRIENDLY SCHOOLS PLUS PROGRAM

The Friendly Schools Plus program operates with a focus on developing positive relationships within the school community. This program incorporates NPPS 'Good Standing' policy with an expectation of responsible behaviour based on mutual respect. Refer to the Health & Wellbeing Policy for further information.

INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGIES

Information and Communication Technology is well resourced within the school in order to support the teaching and learning process for all students. This has enabled us to maintain the student/computer ratio at 1:6. The computer labs are equipped with 28 computers each. All of the computers are networked and have Internet access. We currently have access to 15 Interactive Whiteboard/Panels installed throughout the school. Students experience programs delivered by support teachers and through classroom instruction. All classes have been using iPads over the past 3 years. All classes now have 14 iPads for instructional purposes.

SCHOOL CONTRIBUTION

SCHOOL FACTIONS

New children are placed in factions when they are enrolled.

Parmelia (Red) Challenger (Blue) Sulphur (Gold) Gilmore (Green)

The faction system forms the basis of healthy competition between groups. The basic objective of the system is to foster a feeling of belonging which will enhance school spirit. The school Cross Country will be held in 2nd Term, along with the Winter Carnival. The Faction Athletics Carnival will be held in 3rd Term.



INTERSCHOOL SPORT

North Parmelia Primary School competes with the local primary schools which include Bertram, Leda, Medina, Orelia, Calista, Wellard, Wellard Village, St Vincents and Peter Carnley Anglican School. An interschool Swimming Carnival is held early in the year, usually April. Throughout Term 2 interschool sport (Winter Sport) occurs in areas of Football, Soccer, Netball and Hockey. We also take part in an interschool Cross Country event held in August and the Interschool Athletics Carnival which are held in November (Term 4).

SCHOOL ASSEMBLIES

School assemblies are held regularly (mostly on Tuesday's) commencing at 1.45 pm. Each class takes a turn at organising and running an assembly during which they present an item. Parents are encouraged to attend assemblies to support their children.

Honour certificates are presented at assemblies. Parents are notified if their child is to receive a certificate so they may be present at the assembly. Also presented are Star Writers, Aussie of the Month, Artist of the Month and Mathletics awards.

PARENT/TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Parents are encouraged to discuss their child's progress regularly with the class teacher by arranging a time of mutual satisfaction. A meeting with the class teacher/s is organised at least once a year. Please contact the class teacher to clarify any questions you may have about the learning program. Children will benefit greatly from your interest and involvement in their education.



REPORTS

The school reporting system is in line with the Department of Education requirements. Department endorsed reports will be sent home at the end of each Semester.

SWIMMING

All primary school children have the opportunity to attend swimming lessons as part of their Physical Education program at the Kwinana Recquatic Centre. Children will be issued with permission notes prior to commencement of the lessons. Swimming for 2024 will be advised closer to the beginning of the year.

NOTES FOR ABSENCE

The Department of Education requires an explanation for a child's absence from school. It is preferred that a note be sent to the child's teacher when they return to school, but e-mail or verbal notification is acceptable. In the event of no explanation received, a letter will be sent home asking for an explanation of absence.

TRANSFERS

Please advise the school in advance if you are leaving North Parmelia Primary School to facilitate the transfer. Student records are forwarded by North Parmelia upon notification from the new school of your child's enrolment. Students moving interstate will take their student records with them. All personal items need to be removed from the classroom on your child's last day.



LEAVING SCHOOL GROUNDS & LATE ARRIVALS

Children must be signed out by a parent or guardian at the Administration Building before they are able to leave the school grounds during school hours. Class start time is 8.40 am. Children arriving late to class can find it difficult to settle and organise for the days events and it can cause disruption to the teaching program in progress.

VALUABLE ITEMS

No responsibility can be taken by the school for the protection from damage or theft of items such as mobile telephones which children may bring to school. For this reason children are asked to leave them at home. We do understand that under some circumstances mobile phones are required by students. In these cases all phones must be signed in at the front office at the beginning of the day and signed out at the end, as per the school's mobile phone policy.

HEALTH AND WELL BEING POLICY

The school has a detailed policy for creating a supportive learning environment. This policy is the basis of school and classroom discipline. Discussion on the policy is welcomed. This policy is constantly under review by staff and the School Council. A copy is available on request and the school website. All children are considered to have "good standing". Sometimes choices students make causes "good standing" to be removed. The effect of this is that children may be excluded from certain school based activities and excursions.

ILLNESS OR ACCIDENTS AT SCHOOL

Minor accidents or illness are catered for at school, but in the event of more serious injuries or sickness parents will be notified immediately and asked to collect their children. Therefore, it is imperative that parents keep the school record card up to date by notifying any change in home telephone number and address. Up to date records of parent's places of employment and telephone numbers are required along with an alternative address and telephone number of people who can look after children if no one is at home.

In consideration of others attending the school, please **DO NOT** send your child if he/she is unwell, no matter how much they insist on coming. You are requested to keep your child at home if he/she has any contagious disease or has vomited in the last 12 hours.

SMOKING ON SCHOOL PREMISES

Our School is a smoke free environment. Parents are requested to support this by not smoking anywhere on premises and modelling a healthy attitude by not smoking in view of children arriving or leaving school. Thank you for helping us to promote a healthy ethos.

DOGS

The Department of Education has a **NO DOG POLICY** on school grounds. Although your family pet may be friendly some children may not know the appropriate way to react around your beloved pet. Please do not bring your pet onto school grounds. This rule also applies to any household pet.

LOST PROPERTY

'Lost Property' is kept at school in the Parmelia Centre, please also check with your classroom teachers. Articles of clothing and other items are deposited there if no owner can be found. Please ensure all items are clearly labelled with your child's name.

SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST

A School Psychologist visits to assist teachers and parents with any problems of an academic, behavioural or social nature that a child may be experiencing and that impacts on the child's learning program. Parents will be consulted prior to children taking any tests initiated through the school psychologist. Parents may also request that a child be counselled or tested by the School Psychologist. For any enquiries please contact the school administration team.

SCHOOL ADMISSION RECORDS

- Please constantly update the school with information on where you can be contacted in an emergency and also provide the name of another person to contact if you are unavailable. Correct, up-to-date telephone numbers are ESSENTIAL.
- Please inform the school of any Family Court Orders etc that are in place (you will need to provide copies of relevant documents).
- The school will respect your privacy by not releasing information contained on the admission card to people other than teaching staff and administration staff.
- You will be asked to sign several forms to give permission for the school to use photographs of your child and school internet access agreements.

MONEY

If money is to be sent to school for any purpose, PLEASE PLACE THE CORRECT AMOUNT IN A SEALED AND TAPED ENVELOPE. Mark the child's name, room number and purpose of the money on the outside of the envelope and hand the envelope to the class teacher or school administration. As the school is now issuing receipts for amounts in one transaction over \$15.00 notes sent home to parents will state whether to hand money to the class teacher or to school administration office for an individual receipt.



EXCURSIONS

Excursions to places of interest, attendance at sports carnivals and visits to community services are part of the education program, though a child's attendance is always at the discretion of the school. Parents are required to give written permission for their child to travel by vehicle to venues out of the school confines.

FOOTWEAR

Children are to wear suitable footwear to and from school on all occasions. Thongs and plastic clogs are not permitted to be worn at school.

STAFF MEETINGS

Staff meetings for North Parmelia Primary School are held before/after school hours. These do not disrupt the class programs.

PARENTS AND CITIZENS ASSOCIATION

Fundraising is one of the many important functions of the P & C. Without the help of the committee and parents, many school projects would not be possible. Currently the P&C is supporting the Hip Hop, Reading Eggs, Mathletics, Sports & Sustainability programs. If you would like to become involved in the P&C and their activities please contact the school office for further information.



MOBILE PHONES & SMART WATCHES

The School has a Mobile Phone Policy which can be read in full on our school website. We request all students who bring a mobile phone to school sign the phone in at the Administration building before going to class. The phone is to be switched off and then collected at the end of the day. With the ever growing trend of Smart Watches now being worn by students the school is also implementing a policy for the students wearing these types of watches. In line with the Department of Education (WA) Policy, where a student is wearing a smart watch to school, the expectation is that the smart watch will be placed in "aeroplane mode", whilst the student is on the school grounds.

PEANUT FREE SCHOOL

In 2024 at NPPS there will be students who have severe nut allergies. For this reason, the school is requesting that nuts and products that contain nuts not be brought to school in students' recess and lunch meals. We understand that the request relies on families doing this voluntarily. The teachers will implement strategies to minimise contact between students and are regularly trained on the use of epi-pens. However, we believe that avoiding an incident in the first place is the best strategy.

UNIFORMS

In conjunction with the P&C, North Parmelia Primary School's uniforms are to be purchased from Lowes at Rockingham City Shopping Centre during normal shopping centre hours. Lowes hold all current uniform stock along with faction shirts and hats. Layby facilities, eftpos and credit card facilities are available making this more convenient and accessible for parents and the community.

SCHOOL COUNCIL

The School Council meets once per term and is comprised of parent members, staff members and the Principal. Members to this council are elected at the beginning of each year. The first meeting of the year is a public meeting and all North Parmelia Primary School community members are welcome to attend.

A School Plan is revised annually to address the aims of the school and is based on data gathered from testing, teacher recommendations and parent suggestions. Priorities are decided collaboratively with staff and the School Council and are supported by school, special purpose grants and P & C funds.

LIBRARY

The North Parmelia Primary School library is supported by our own Library Officer 2 days per week, with the help of classroom teachers when they are absent. Children's borrowings and returns are recorded on the computer and each book may be borrowed for two weeks at a time. Any book that is damaged or lost is the responsibility of parents to replace. Library books must go home in a library bag.

HEAD LICE

Unfortunately, head lice are part of the natural community. They will never be eradicated. The best thing that can be done is to control them through continuous and persistent effort.

Head lice can only be caught by close head to head contact. They do not jump or fly. Anyone can be infested with head lice, however they are most common in children, and it is not known why some children are more susceptible than others.

MANAGING HEAD LICE: PREVENTION

Head Lice are <u>NOT</u> a sign of poor hygiene. In fact they thrive in clean hair. The most effective way to reduce the likelihood of infestation are:

- Encourage children not to share hats, combs or brushes.
- Brush hair twice a day which damages lice, deters them from breeding.
- Tying long hair back.
- Weekly check of children's hair (preferable Friday) so treatment can be initiated early if infestation is identified.



TREATMENT

There are a number of head lice treatments available from local pharmacies. The Health Department of WA recommends that all treatment options be discussed with a pharmacist. There are alternative products available containing natural pesticides such as tea tree oil. The hair conditioner treatment has also been known to have good results. These products have shown varying degrees of effectiveness.

If you find head lice:

- Children should be excluded from school until a day after treatment has commenced.
- Treat with a recommended solution without delay. Be sure to read instructions carefully, and saturate the hair near the scalp.
- Layer the hair and divide into sections when applying the solution and again when combing out eggs after treatment.
- Check all other family members, including adults, and treat only those that are infested.
- Avoid drying hair with hair dryer after applying treatment solution as this destroys the insecticide.
- After treatment remove eggs with fingernails or metal fine tooth comb.
- Inform staff at school and close contacts/playmates so they too can check for head lice.
- Check hair every day for up to 21 days after treatment and remove any eggs found and thereafter weekly. Finding eggs after treatment does not necessarily indicate reinfestation or treatment failure.

IF TREATMENT UNSUCCESSFUL OR REINFESTATION OCCURS

- Check that you have informed all possible contacts including the school.
- Repeat the above steps take special care to layer hair when applying lotion and remove eggs after treatment.
- If treatment fails twice, try a product with a different pesticide.

The single most effective way to control head lice is for children's hair to be brushed twice a day, checked once a week, and treated if lice are found. Regular inspection and manual removing of eggs from the hair is tedious, but is as important as chemical treatment. Constant attention and care in the household, combined with good communication among contacts, are the best weapons against head lice.

PRESCRIBED MEDICATION/MEDICAL ACTION PLANS

The potential hazards involving the misuse of any drug or medication can be severe. The school needs to be informed if student performance or behaviour is likely to be affected by medication which is being self-administered.

If a student is required to carry and self-administer prescribed medicine while at school, the parent/guardian/carer must advise the Principal of all relevant details, eg. what form the medication takes, the correct dose and the symptoms associated with misuse, overuse, or under-use as indicated by the treating doctor. For short term conditions such as dental treatment or period pain where analgesics are self-administered by the student, notification of self-medication by the student is not required.

Only the quantity of medication for the school day can be brought onto the school premises by the student.

School staff are not expected to administer prescribed medication or treatments which require specialist training, such as giving injections.

If the student is determined to be incapable of self-administering prescribed medication, discussion is necessary between the Principal, school staff, parent/guardian/carer to determine what assistance is needed and what can be provided by school staff. If school staff are to administer medication to the student the following protocol applies:

- a) parent/guardian/carer must provide written authority for the school staff accepting responsibility to administer the prescribed medication, by completing a Health Care Authorisation Form.
- b) parent/guardian/carer is responsible for the submission in writing of any requirements of the student for medication, including details from the medical practitioner, and of the circumstances for the appropriate use and application of the medication.
- c) parent/guardian/carer must provide the medication in a properly labelled container (name of student, name of medication, dose to be taken). Minimal quantities only should be sent to school unless there is a need for larger amounts to be sent, by agreement with the school;
- d) school staff can only administer prescribed medication following doctor's instructions and signed Health Care Authorisation Form and Principal's authorisation.
